### The framework law 266/91

- Art. 1
- •... recognizes the social value and function of volunteering as an expression of participation, solidarity and pluralism, promotes the developement protecting its autonomy and encourages the contribution for the achieving of social, civil and cultural aims









## The framework law 266/91 Six criteria to define a voluntary organization

- Composition
- Juridical form
- Structure/functioning
- •Free costless
- Solidarity
- obligations









### The framework law 266/91 Benefits

- Stamp and registry taxes
- Donations and legacies
- Marginal incomes











## The framework law 266/91 The special fund for volunteering

- •Foundation with banking origin: contribution of 1/15 of the incomes goes in a regional fund
- Estabilishment of Voluntary Services Centers
- •The fund is managed by a Management Commitee









## The framework law 266/91 The managing committee

- Region: 1 member
- Largest Voluntary Organizations: 4 members
- Ministry of Welfare: 1 member
- Saving banks and Foundation: 7 members
- Association among Italian Saving Banks (ACRI):
   1 member
- Local authorities of the Region: 1 member



### Voluntary Support Centers: task

- •Stimulate the growth of solidarity, **promote** new voluntary initiatives
- Consuelling, planning
- Training
- •Communication, information, data











### Voluntary Support Centers: numbers

- •77 CSV in Italy (69 provincial, 8 regional)
- 95% of membership is made of
   9.000 Voluntary organizations (20,7% of VO in Italy)
- •415 point of presence (offices, delegations, windows)











### Voluntary Support Centers: more numbers

- •1099 employees with open work contract = 702 full time jobs
- •2478 workers project specific = 3 full time jobs
- •63% women
- Average age: 37
- •75% jobs services
- •25% managing administrative




